NH DePass (b.1990, New Orleans) is an artist from New Orleans, Louisiana. He holds an MFA in Sculpture from The Pratt Institute, Brooklyn, NY and a BA from The Savannah College of Art and Design, Savannah, GA. In his work there is disjuncture between old and new: a tension between craft and digital innovation. DePass uses classical techniques like hand sewing and carpentry while incorporating digital graphics and printing to create works that disturb historical and cultural timelines.

In 2024, his work has been featured at Ross + Kramer Gallery in New York, and Swivel Gallery. In 2021, his work was featured in the solo exhibition Form Destroyer at Thierry Goldberg Gallery in New York City. Frank Holliday (b. 1957, Greensboro, NC) is a painter who lives and works in New York. He gained recognition for his work in the 1970's and 1980's and was associated with the social scene of Club 57, paving the way for New York City's underground nightlife. Frank Holliday earned his BFA from the School of Visual Arts, NY and the San Francisco Art Institute. His work has been featured in numerous shows including at Mucciaccia Gallery, NY and Singapore, the Carlo Bilotti Museum, Rome, MoMA, NY, Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, Geneva, and Club 57, NY, among many others.

His work is also housed in prestigious institutional collections at the Weatherspoon Museum, North Carolina, at the Museum of Modern Art, New York and at Frederick Russe, Stockholm.

Kiah Celeste

b. 1994, Brooklyn, New York

Kiah Celeste (B.1994, Brooklyn, NY) is a multi-dimensional artist whose work for the last four years has transcended fitting into one category or medium. Living a peripatetic life since leaving her native Brooklyn, Celeste moved from her university background in photography into three-dimensional production. Kiah spent her time completing artist residencies in Barcelona, Vienna, and Frankfort (KY), as well as solo exhibitions in Chicago, New York and Louisville. She has worked and exhibited internationally from Brooklyn, Abu Dhabi, Berlin, Hong Kong and Barcelona to Louisville. In 2021, Celeste received the inaugural 21C Artadia Award in Louisville. Her work has recently been acquired by the Speed Art Museum, KMAC Museum and University of Kentucky Art Museum. In 2023, she held a solo exhibition in Lisbon with DOCUMENT, and a two person exhibition at Swivel Gallery in Brooklyn. Celeste presented a solo booth at NADA Miami 2023 with Swivel Gallery and exhibited as part of the IN/SITU program at ExpoChicago, co-curated by Swivel Gallery and DOCUMENT in 2024.

Constantly searching and gleaning objects from her urban and industrial environment, Kiah Celeste forages for materials that speak to her. Her practice typically consists of a few components, to which Celeste often incorporate a motif to establish a visual cadence of repetition, balance, motion and variation. Using almost exclusively discarded or secondhand items, and minimal hardware, she creates something new and fortuitous out of decay. By asserting the cruciality of sustainability in the world, Kiah's work negates the gratuitous nature of buying new, synthetic materials only to enter into inevitable disorder as time moves. Although these works are made with primarily synthetic, industrial and household materials, the forms they take on allude the organic, the surreal and non-function. By adhering to rigorous principles of sustainability and low intervention, she often challenges physics, with compositions which carefully balance through tension, weight, flexibility and gravity.

These texturally rich compositions highlight the inherent beauty of the objects, while retiring their original practical functions. Kiah's latest works involve more forceful interventions such as heat, cutting, and shaping to create new forms and textures that challenge the viewer's perception of discarded objects. With a multifarious identity as a Black and Jewish woman, both feminine and androgynous, and introverted and social, among other seemingly contrasting combinations and in betweens, the sense of her un-belonging finds respite in the embrace of seemingly disparate materials to create a cohesive whole, finding freedom in self, the world, and creative practice. Kiah Celeste currently lives and works in Louisville, KY.

Alejandro García Contreras (b. 1982, Tapachula Chiapas, MX) characterizes his creative work by experimentation and dialogue between different materials and technical resources, making his work a mix between various media such as painting, sculpture, photography, video and graphics. The themes of his work are linked to his personality, and through his artistic projects, he explores topics and themes inspired by contemporary popular culture, Mexican folklore, myth, occultism and religion.

He holds a bachelor's degree in Visual Arts from the National Institute of Fine Arts (Instituto Nacional de Bellas Artes) in Mexico City, Mexico.

His work was the winning acquisition of the 2006 Artfest WTC, and he is a two-time recipient of the FONCA / Young Creators Scholarship. Contreras held a two person exhibition at Pioneer Works in 2024, and respectively shown at Proyecto NASAL, Gamma Galleria, David Castillo, Albertz Benda, House of Gaga, Travesia Cuatro, Saenger Galeria, and Eito Eiko among others. 

Joseph Cochran II (b. 1990, New York City) is a multidisciplinary artist whose work spans photography, video, and archival research. He explores the complex interplay between advanced industrial societies, their systems, and their impact on society. Traumatic temporal experiences have driven him to delve into contemporary societies' processes and practices and examine our conscious and subconscious engagement in today's globalized neoliberal economic structures.

Through his photography, Cochran creates images that blur the lines between documentary and diary, anthropology, ethnography, and philosophy, urging the viewer to look beyond the surface and analyze the complex relationships between subjects, whether they appear as symbols, individuals, institutions, or entire societies. His works have been shown in both the United States and on an international scale at galleries such as Swivel Gallery (Brooklyn, NY), Gold + Beton (Cologne, DE), and Decoratelier (Brussels, BE). His work was also featured in the 2024 Malta Biennale.
