Intricate compositions reference the cross-stitching in Persian rugs made by his maternal relatives. He explores the intersection of craft and social practice, and intercultural ideas surrounding embroidery and geometry.

FELIX BEAUDRY

Felix Beaudry programs an industrial knitting machine to create textile-based sculpture and wall hangings. Drawing upon personal experience, bodily transitions, desire, and gender, Beaudry experiments with the concepts of clothing and nudity. Apparel changes the physical experience in daily life and also acts as an extension of persona. Beaudry's fiber works reflect the space between skin and world. Imagery is programmed and then fed into a Stoll knitting machine. Part of the process entails Beaudry pushing the limits of the machine's and the technology's capabilities, similar to the way one can push the boundaries of the body.

CALVIN KIM

Through enigmatic paintings, Calvin Kim seeks to preserve and prolong the unfolding of dreamlike, intimate moments. Like peering through a window to catch a glimpse of someone else's dream, the works transmit psychological undercurrents through form, color, light, and texture, conveying the mood of an experience rather than mere description. Kim's subjects are depicted amid contemplative, emotional states. Absurdity, humor, and lightness reappear throughout Kim's works, offsetting themes of melancholy and vulnerability. An atmosphere of magic suffuses his scenes – from the warm, shimmering glow of the headlamps, to a cluster of wildflowers blooming from the darkness – indicative of nature's continuous cycles of birth, death, and renewal.

CALVIN KIM (b. 1992, Los Angeles, CA) currently lives and works in New York City. Kim received his M.F.A. in Visual Arts from Columbia University, his B.F.A. and B.A. in Psychology at Cornell University, and was a recipient of the Ellen Battell Stoeckel Fellowship to attend Yale Norfolk.
