

Kazuki Matsushita 松下和暉

Born 1992 in Tokyo, Japan Lives and works in Tokyo

Matsushita is a Japanese painter and poet who approaches painting linguistically using the technique of the anagram. He uses his own short poems as the titles of his paintings, and creates paintings based on the motifs of anagrams made by rearranging the poems. The motifs, chosen with a mixture of the unconscious and the conscious, reflect the influence of early 20th century American literature and his own objectified view of the history of three generations of his family, born and raised in Tokyo.



Toru Otani 大谷透

Born 1988 in Kanagawa, Japan Lives and works in Tokyo

Otani uses the back side of sandpapers, empty cigarette packages and vintage maps as a canvas and guide for his interventions. The objects, such as prewar textbooks, used notes and postcards, which become the foundation for his works are often sourced in internet auctions. Attracted to enigmatic marks and images such as human hand, the sun, eyeballs, etc., Otani uses colored pencils to erase the excess elements and information which might identify the marks' meaning. Otani says this process reminds him of "the feeling of seeing an abandoned billboard for a brief moment while driving down a national road, but somehow you cannot get it out of your head". For Otani, an artwork is something like this; it's hard not to look at and think about, even though you don't understand the importance of its existence.



Yuu Takamizawa 高見澤ゆう

Born 1990 in Tokyo, Japan Lives and works in Tokyo

Takamizawa refers to the value of the phenomenon called art and the artist's identity through his works. The subject matter, 'Originality in Art', is acted upon as if the concept still exists, even though it has been debated countless times since the advent of the readymade. In this context, he explores the possibilities and impossibilities of originality in art and questions the difference between objects called artwork and just objects, while attempting to unravel how an object is perceived as art.

In addition, Takamizawa has been making artworks using materials that are seemingly related to the art world, but whose very existence is being ignored. Examples include the repeatedly displayed "study(sox04042018)", featuring a pair of used socks, a painting made by silk screening a MoMA questionnaire that he stumbled upon during his visits, a cardboard box used to transport artworks, certificates of authenticity, and an inspection photograph for checking the condition of artworks. These works are not only an examination of the ontology of artwork as an object but also of Takamizawa's attitude towards the structure of art itself.



Tsutomu Shimomura

Born 1993 in Nakashibetsu, Hokkaido, Japan Lives and works in Tokyo

Tsutomu Shimomura's work is a collaboration with various anonymous artists using pseudonyms, led by the artist Shogo Shimizu (b.1993, Hokkaido). Through the awkward collaboration between Shimizu, who devises the concept, and the artist, who is in charge of the actual work, the artist considers the subjectivity of the artist. His previous exhibitions include a group show at 4649 (2018) and a solo show at MX Gallery (New York/2019). Each exhibition is based on a theme set by Shogo Shimizu, and the actual work is done by another anonymous artist who works with objects, paintings, and photographs. In this show, he will collaborate with an anonymous photographic artist to create photographic works that express the anguish of impoverished urbanites, who are often ignored in art, through a parody of postwar Japanese photographic history.
